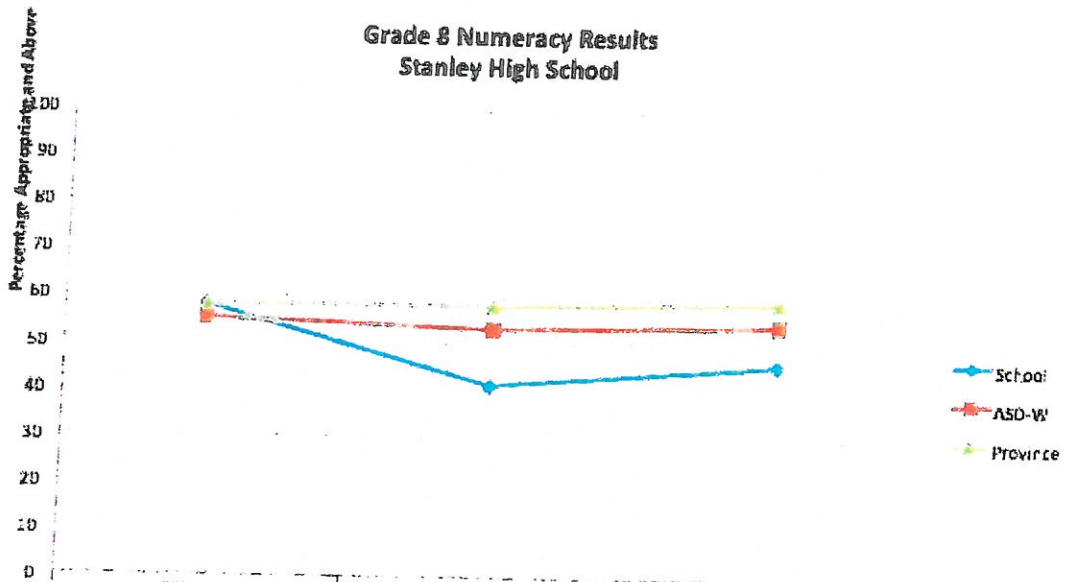

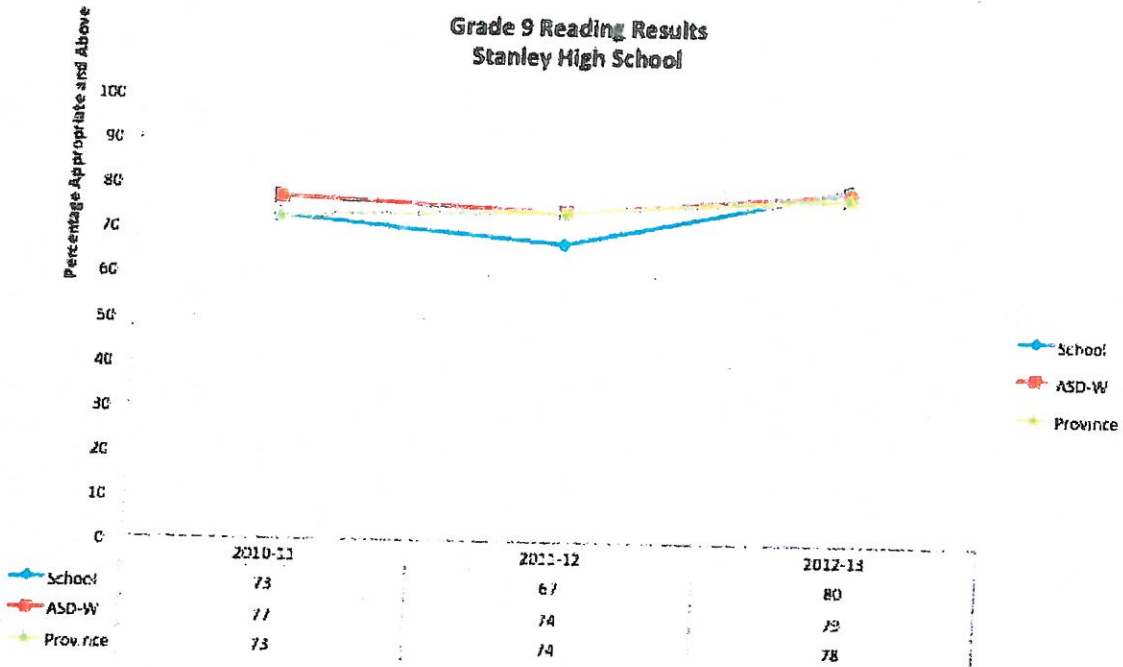
Grade 7 Reading Results Stanley High School



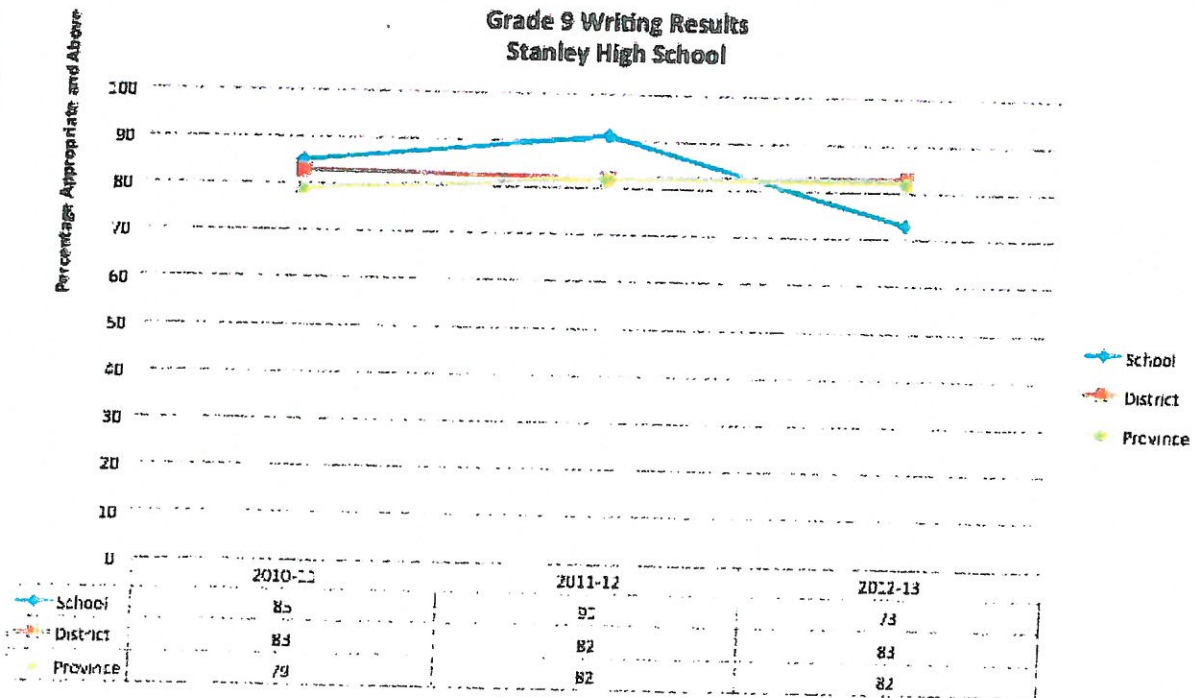
