Hi Anne,

Thank you for the question regarding sample size and its impact on assessment results as compared to district and province. While the teachers may remain consistent at both schools students and class sizes do change. We tend to see sample size come into more of a play in class sizes that are very small and can influence the representation of the results. For example, if there is a class of four students and one is below appropriate the overall results will come back as 75%, while one not passing in a class of 21 will come back as 95%. I have attached a slide that shows enrolment per grade level at both SES and SHS for the past 5 years. You will see that we are not dealing with unusually small classes at either school.

The key to provincial assessment results is to use them to identify trends overtime for schools, districts and the province. Specifically at the school level, staff should reflect on results yearly by looking at what factors have influenced results positively or negatively, keeping in mind this is not the only student results they are looking at.


I was interested to notice the differences in achievement relative to dist and province year over year given that staff has not changed. I wonder if the sample size has an influence in such a small population.
