Given recent discussions between the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development and your university regarding intersession courses, the Department will allow interested students to take advantage of this opportunity. It is understood that these courses are available 100% online, there is no physical attendance required, and that the courses are asynchronous.

For students on track to graduate in June 2020, who are interested and have parental consent, they may enrol in intersession courses for the purpose of accruing credit towards their degree beginning in the Fall of 2020. This would be concurrent with their obligations to complete the public-school year as currently being offered under the continuity of learning plan.

Once enrolled in these courses, students of the public education system would be obliged to abide by any policies or requirements of the university offering the course.

It is understood that the student will be responsible for any related fees, including tuition, and supporting technology.
