TIPS FOR ONLINE CLASS PARTICIPATION

Make learning from home the best it can be.





FIND A SAFE, QUIET, COMFORTABLE AREA TO PARTICIPATE ONLINE.

Concentration is a funny thing: some people need absolute silence in which to learn, others thrive in the centre of the action. Do what is right for you, but if you find it hard to concentrate, you may need to move to a calmer space.



REPORT TO EACH CLASS IN YOUR SCHEDULE, EVERYDAY (BOTH IN SCHOOL AND ONLINE).

Remember working during school hours is not an acceptable explanation for not being present. It is stated in the Return to School: Direction for School Districts and Schools document that: "The Education Act continues to apply and, as a result, it is still prohibited to hire students during school hours".



USE GOOD DIGITAL ETIQUETTE.

Out of respect for your teacher and other students, other individuals or household members are asked not to participate in the video call. Minimize noise by wearing headphones, if possible and always remember to mute your microphone when you are not speaking.



BE RESPECTFUL.

Say "hello" and "goodbye" when you join and leave your video call and use respectful language in between. Be willing to listen and allow others to have their time to speak. If you have your camera on, dress appropriately like you would if you were going to school. Stay in your video call until your teacher says it's okay to leave.
