All students signed a Pursuit of Excellence with their parent/guardian and we must abide by that contract with regard to all extra-curricular as well as co-curricular activities. Being on a team or a club and attending field trips is a privilege not a right! Positive student behavior is the basis of participating in these activities. We have had many conversations with our students about the importance of their behavior. We have reminded students that they are representing the entirety of their school while in the community. All students are to follow the BOLT Matrix,

as outlined in the student handbook. Bolt brings clarity and predictability to the expectations we place on students regarding their conduct and participation in school and school activities.

~ Our District has a very clear attendance policy. Students are to attend school regularly. Students who have missed an excessive amount of days will forfeit the privilege of being involved in school activities and trips.

~ Students who have had either in school or out-of-school suspension within ten days of a trip will not participate on the trip. For teams and clubs the student does not have the privilege to attend the game or event.

~ The expectation is for the student to attend school and complete curricular schoolwork if they are ineligible to attend the trip.

~ Students who choose not to adhere to the rules and expectations while on the field trip will not attend the next field trip. All future eligibility will be contingent on the students' choices and actions.

This Thursday at 1:55 p.m., we will be having a **MADD** presentation in our gym for all students. Parent and guardians are always welcome. The film being shown this year is called **Over the Edge** and it opens with a fictional story that illustrates the tragic consequences of driving while impaired. The film is very emotional and powerful. So why is it important for middle level students to view **Over the Edge?** Although your child is not driving yet, they will soon be thinking about the future possibility of driving. They may already find themselves in situations where alcohol or drugs are present. As well, they have opportunities to ride with an inexperienced teen driver. As they learn to be more independent, they need to know the facts and be ready to avoid dangerous situations involving impaired driving.
