Orange Shirt Day is held annually on September 30th in Canadian communities with students and staff being encouraged to wear an orange shirt to school.

~ Homework is important: We do ask that students please read every night for at least 20 minutes. Practice your Math skills, watch French T.V. to practice your oral skills, this is great for the French Immersion students as well as the students who study post intensive French.

~ **Bolt:** Barnhill Memorial School will continue with our Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) called BOLT. We review BOLT expectations with the students on a daily basis.

Weekly we draw three winners and the students win pens/pencils, water bottles, lanyards or a USB bracelet.
