Baxter brings quiet confidence to UNBSJ women's side

Rather than ramble on with pregame speeches or trash talk op-ponents once play has begun, the Simonds High product just goes about her business and carries

herself with a quiet confidence. The third-year bio-psych major is one of the reasons the UNB Saint John Seawolves have an outside chance to make this year's Atlantic Collegiate Athletic Association playoffs. Granted, a lot has to go right in order for the Seawolves to finish among the top four in the six-team confer-

Fifth-place UNBSJ (3-5-0) visits fourth-place King's College (4-4-0) Saturday at 2 p.m. in Halifax, where the Seawolves will remain for their Sunday morning match at 11 a.m. against second-place Mount Saint Vincent University (5-2-1).

"We're definitely looking forward to this weekend," said Bax-ter, who turns 20 on Monday. "I think we showed (by beating St. Thomas last Sunday) that we're in the running for playoffs. We're hoping to surprise everyone and then get into playoffs and stir things up. We just have to bring the intensity that we brought (last) Sunday and give it our all and show some heart."

Baxter's heart has been in soccer since she was a little girl. Although she also played

basketball, volleyball and rugby at Simonds, there was no ques-tion which sport she would pursue at UNBSI.

"I've known Carly since she was 12," Seawolves head coach

Jason Brown said. "She really is one of those truly nice people. She's very polite and very pleasant and cares about her team mates." But when it's time to play the

ame, Baxter isn't quite as nice. While she respects her oppon-ents, Brown said the veteran centre-back has "developed a bit of an edge 'Some of her tackles have been

a little bit harder and a little bit stronger," the coach said. "She's a really effective competitor, and she's still able to be herself. She just does the job, she plays things simple and she's tremendously

unselfish

Baxter has taken her share of teasing about her laid-back na-ture, but her demeanour has had a positive influence on her teammates.

"She's so calm and I think the fact that she's not emotional serves us well," Brown said. "We have some emotional players and they can tend to get caught up in the rivalry of the game and Carly is just that calming force That's who she is, and her team-mates really respect that about her and I think other players in the league respect that about her. She plays hard, she plays

Baxter has gradually become more vocal, doing what's needed and expected of a player in her position. "This year, especially since I'm

playing centre-back, you have to talk a lot to everyone," she said. "Jason is on me about that." Brown is coaching both the

men's and women's teams this year, a scenario that allows the two sides to feed off each other. The men's squad is hosting next year's national tournament, meaning UNBSJ gets an automatic berth. The women's squad is hoping next year offers similar opportunities for them. They'll have to win the ACAA to qualify. "I think next year, we'll definite-

ly be building towards nationals," Baxter said. "This year was a big building year for us and I think next year we'll definitely have nationals as a goal."
