### **Simonds Memorial Grove**

In the Simonds High School Memorial Grove, trees are planted in memory of a student, teacher, group, friend or family member or to celebrate a certain grad class. Our Memorial Grove has been growing and looks great! In fact, the grove is almost full; only a couple more trees will be planted to allow space for the ones there to mature. The grove is located outside the gym and continuing down the school driveway by the playing field. Alumni have donated the Princeton Golden Yellow maple trees. A lovely new sign on the side of the school identifies the grove. This past June, four new memorial trees were planted. Accompanying this article is a picture of the Melvin family beside a tree in memory of their son, Ryan, who passed away sadly in February 2019 at the age of 32. In the picture are Ryan's parents, Diana and Ross Melvin, wife Jessie, daughter Amadea, and sister Erica with her husband Mike and son Logan. Each tree has special significance and tells a story of a life cut short or a class remembered.

Individual alumni or classes planning future reunions are invited to consider placing a memorial tree in the grove. It is such a beautiful way in which to remember a classmate/friend/family member. To commemorate each tree, a plaque with name plates honors those remembered. In addition, a picture and short biography will be placed in our Wall of Remembrance along with the plaque. What a huge honour and tribute that will be to the hard work of those soccer and basketball team members as well as their teacher coach Mr. Art Pottle! A sincere thanks goes out to Doug Deering for his assistance and to Ferdie Forgey for great records of the team memorabilia! ### Anica! She's Got Talent!

Katey (Wilson) Day-Reick (1987) is a lady with multiple amazing talents! She has had many different jobs / careers in her life so far, but the rock song in her heart has always been the background music.

After receiving a Christmas gift of a guitar when she was 12, Katey first began to perform in paid gigs in Market Square in Saint John when she was 13. She sang in school variety shows, but her real journey into singing came at the age of 19 when she was a member of the local group Windjammer. She was a musician and booking agent for that group for 14 years, touring the Atlantic provinces and Maine. This trio opened for groups such as Trooper, Jeff Healey, April Wine and Great Big Sea. When the band broke up, she moved to Halifax and did solo gigs, including being a personal musician with Bruce Guthro. Later she ventured back to New Brunswick, settling in Moncton where she was a member of another band for several years.

Katey plays several instruments including guitar, bass, harmonica and mandolin. However, her voice with so much depth and power is her main instrument. She has sung different musical genres including folk and jazz and blues, but rock music is her forte.

While singing solo or in groups in clubs, bars and other venues, Katey gleaned experience in several other careers to pay the bills. In Saint John, Halifax and Moncton, she was employed by radio and TV stations; she did reporting, made commercials and hosted morning shows. Several years ago, she wrote, directed and performed in her own rock musical, Deception; it played in 5 locations in the Maritimes.
