#### **November's Literacy Tip:**



As parents most of you recognize the importance of reading to your child. However, have you considered the learning opportunities which can take place when you share a book together?

To get the most out of your shared reading, encourage your child to look at the pictures, encourage them to look at the words also. Are there words or parts of words that they can read themselves or recognize? When you do these two simple things, you are helping your child with using reading strategies to sound out words, look at spelling patterns, and work on understanding what your child is reading. These are key skills that help your child move towards being independent readers. Please continue to read with your child every day. It's one of the most beneficial things you can do to help your child learn.

- Proof of age (birth certificate, passport)
- Medicare card & Proof of immunization
